

## Elvis (12A) 2022

Starring: Tom Hanks, Austin Butler, Olivia de Jonge

There's a big clue in the title....yes, this film is about Elvis Presley. Directed by Baz Luhrmann, the story charts Elvis' life from childhood, his breakthrough into the world of rock 'n' roll and the ups and downs of his career and its challenges. The narrative is that of his manager, Colonel Tom Parker, a controversial character himself.

Nominated for 8 Oscars and winner of 2 BAFTAs for Best Leading Actor (Austin Butler) and Best Costume Design (Catherine Martin).

## What's Love Got to Do With It? (12A) 2022

#### Starring: Mim Shaikh, Iman Boujelouah, Lily James, Emma Thompson

Director, Shekhar Kapur, and writer, Jemima Khan, have created a wonderfully uplifting story of the search for love in the modern world. While documentary maker Zoe watches out for Mr Right on her dating apps, her childhood friend, Kaz, prepares for his assisted marriage arranged by his parents to a bride in Pakistan, who he has never met. Zoe decides to make a documentary following Kaz's journey to Lahore to meet his bride but ends up learning more about her own feelings on love and marriage than she expects. A truly joyful film.

The tone is distinctly feelgood, but the film, directed by Shekhar Kapur, thoughtfully explores the different ways that relationships can be built, and what cultures can teach one another. The Independent **1hr48mins**

## **A Man Called Otto** (15) **2022**

#### Starring: Tom Hanks, Mariana Trevino, Rachel Keller

A film that redefines the meaning of family. Nominated for 5 awards, including Best Actor and Best Original Score, it examines the lifeaffirming relationship of Otto Anderson with his new neighbour. Widowed and thoroughly grumpy, Otto is about to give up on life completely, when Marisol and her family move in next door and life suddenly causes Otto to wake up again. Superbly directed by Marc Forster, Tom Hanks' portrayal of Otto is credible and moving, with moments of delightfully unexpected comedy.

## **Oppenheimer** (15) **2023**

#### Starring: Cillian Murphy, Emily Blunt, Matt Damon

Christopher Nolan directs this epic on the life of the man behind the development of the atomic bomb. The film tracks the career of physicist, J. Robert Oppenheimer, from university through his role in creating the atomic bomb, regarded as a key factor in ending World War II, to his political involvement after the war. Winner of Best of Show and Truly Moving Picture awards, this is a blockbuster movie and must see of 2023. At three hours' long, though, bring a cushion.
